


Sticky: What Articles I'm Currently Writing (Updated regularly) – Request Article topics Here!



Last update: July 15th

As the title says, this article will let everyone know what l'm working on and approximately how close new articles are to being released. Sometimes I get a bug about something and write/publish a whole article in a few days, but it'II usually show up here before publishing.

Also, if you have a request for an article topic, please leave it in the comments below. I may or may not write it, but the odds are much higher if you suggest it. I make no promises though.

## **Change log:**

- July 15th: I published the article on linguistic warfare to patrons, it will be published publicly on July 22nd. Added a current word count to the "Did Jesus have to die before God could forgive sins?†article.
- July 6th: On the 4th of July, I published the article on how Jesus freed us from Satan's tyranny (No, that's not a coincidence ðŸ~‰) Patrons got it July 4th, it will be published publicly on July 11th. Updated the description for the the article on "linguistic warfareâ€

- below. Added an article on if Jesus's death was necessary to forgive sins to the working articles list.

## Articles on which l'm currently working

To be clear, I only actively work on a few at a time, the rest get the short end of the stick. However, I thought you all might like to see what I' working on, so here's a list. ðŸ™, It's not a complete list, but these are the major ones.

## **"Working†articles** (In rough order of priority)

- Recognizing Linguistic warfare. Often, the very words and phrases we use to discuss the gender/sexual debate subconsciously cede the debate through the very words/phrases themselves. That is, the words/phrases themselves assume that the false position is correct. We'II take a look at this. This will be an odd article for me since l'II cite very little scripture, but I think it's important to recognize this when we engage in debate and defend the faith. Currently, it's very close to completion and l'II likely publish it in the next week or two.
- Article Series â€"The Biblical case for AND against Penal Substitutionary Atonement
   (PSA) This is something of an offshoot from my article about ignored reasons that Jesus died.
   I've had doubts about PSA ever since I read Ezekiel 18 many years ago, and other passages give me pause as well. It will take many articles to unpack completely and I have a rough outline in my intro to the PSA article series.
  - Did Jesus have to die before God could forgive sins? Matthew says that Jesus's blood was poured out "for the forgiveness of sinsâ€, so the answer would seem obvious. However, the Greek word can mean other things and Jesus Himself used it in Luke 4:18 (twice) to describe why He came, and it doesn't have to do with forgiveness at all. This will be another "word study†article and the next in the PSA series. It's currently at about 7k words.
  - Does Isaiah 53 support PSA? This will be a verse-by-verse walk through the end of Isaiah 52 and all of Isaiah 53.
  - The Early Church Fathers on Penal Substitutionary Atonement (with quotes). This is part of the PSA series. Some say that the early church had never heard of PSA, some say they it was the only thing they taught. I will examine this in exhaustive (and likely exhausting) detail. (Update: there's a large element of ignoring context, ignoring the author's other works, and even some downright deceptive practices by the source most PSA guys use.)
- Is Peter the foundation of the (*Catholic*) Church? I had completely forgotten about this draft until recently. The passage that Catholics use to support the idea of Papal infallibility is Matthew 16, but the Greek grammar actually makes it impossible that Peter is the foundation of the church.

- Does the Mosaic Law still apply? What about mixed fabrics? Sex during Mensuration?
   The 10 Commandments? Suggested in the comments. No idea when l'II get to it, but it's on the list. ðŸ™,
- Revelation Part 2: The Millennial Kingdom, The Rapture, etc. This would be a follow-up to my article on Revelation, covering the things that one didn't.
- The BOS Bible. Okay, this technically isn't an article, but I have an ongoing project to translate the New Testament from Greek to English. You can read what's done so far (~70% of the NT by word count, just Luke, Acts, and Revelation to go.) here: BOS Bible.com. I'm almost halfway through Luke as of November 2024, and I'm aiming to translate a chapter a week.

**â**€œBack Burner†articles. (*lâ*€™*ll probably get to them eventually, but theyâ*€™*re low priority right now.*)

- The Masoretic Text (MT) vs the Septuagint (LXX) vs Dead Sea Scrolls. This would be a companion article to my article on New Testament textual criticism, this time looking at the Old Testament.
- Was Paul Always Single, Or Was He A Widower? Surprisingly, I think there's solid evidence from the Bible itself that Paul was married at some point. His wife probably died, or possibly divorced him after he became a Christian, but that Paul was a widower seems most likely.
- Biblically, What's the Role of Men in Society and Marriage? This one has been mostly complete for rather a long time, but something about it just feels "offâ€. I don't want to publish something that I can't fully stand behind, so it's been sitting for a while.
- Random other ones. I have a few dozen article drafts right now, mostly stubs or reminders to write articles on said topics. If you see something l've said I would write about that's not on either list above, that's probably where it is.
